

Ricky Diwan QC is a barrister and queen's counsel practising from Essex Court Chambers for the last twenty years and specialising in the fields of international commercial and investment arbitration both as arbitrator and counsel.

He co-drafted the International Arbitration Act for Mauritius (2008) with Salim Moollan QC and Toby Landau QC and also co-drafted the ICCA International Handbook on Commercial Arbitration for England & Wales (2015) with VV Veeder QC. He is a member of the UK ICC Committee.

He has acted as counsel in a number of important arbitration decisions before the English Court in the context of jurisdictional challenges and New York Convention recognition and enforcement applications. This includes *Griffin v Poland* [2018] 1 Lloyd's Rep 410, being the first successful application before the English High Court to set aside an investor state award on jurisdictional grounds and *Kabab-Ji v Kout Food Group* [2020] EWCA Civ 6, where he successfully resisted recognition and enforcement of an ICC arbitral award on jurisdictional grounds before the Court of Appeal.
