Over the past five years these have all been as lead counsel, representing local and international clients. A number of these disputes have been for sizeable claims, up to values of ZAR3.5billion</p> <p>I have sat as an arbitrator, adjudicator, and independent expert in excess of 150 separate disputes, and also as a chairman of inquiries. Most recently these have included substantial disputes between an international contractor and a South African state owned entity regarding works undertaken at a nuclear power station.</p> <p>A number of the arbitrations in which I have sat as arbitrator and adjudicator have been disputes of an international nature, including a number of international arbitrations.</p> <p>I have been listed as an adjudicator on the NEC user group as well as on the adjudicator panel for Transnet and Eskom.</p>
